The 5th edition of <u>enlightED</u>, the international conference on education, technology and innovation, which has established itself as a global leader in educational innovation, came to a close today. After two hybrid editions, this year the event returned to an in-person format on 16 and 17 November, with 2,000 people in attendance. This edition is also growing with the support of the "la Caixa" Foundation, which has joined Telefónica Foundation, IE University and South Summit as one of the organisers of the event.

With the **theme of** *Connecting innovation. Education that transforms*, enlightED 2022 addressed three main topics that were the focus of the conference's **21**





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presentations: the digital skills of today and tomorrow; disruptive classrooms; and advancing equity and inclusion through innovation.

The closing event was led by **Pilar Alegría**, Spanish Minister of Education and Training, and **José María Álvarez-Pallete**, Chairman of Telefónica, who highlighted the role of education in promoting social inclusion, reducing inequalities and boosting the countries' competitiveness.
